Items	Details/Criteria/Procedure
1. Number of Grants	The number of grants will be determined based on appropriateness and the available budget.
2. Funding Amount	The maximum amount per grant shall not exceed 100,000 THB.
3. Grant Duration	2 fiscal years starting from the fiscal year received
4. Applicant Qualifications	Current students studying doctoral program or master program with thesis-based plan
5. Grant Support	Supported expenses on research are subject by 2 payments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 1st payment: 80% of funding upon signing an agreement with the Graduate School ● 2nd payment: 20% of funding after the disseminating completed work to the community by certificate with grantees informing the Graduate School for approval.
6. Criteria of Consideration	<p>6.1 Research is related to problem solving in the community within Southern Thailand, aims to create public impact in society and/or economic impact, and expected outcome could be concrete and empirically demonstrable.</p> <p>6.2 The Graduate School shall appoint a committee to consider, select and evaluate research projects of applicants based on the Graduate School's funding allocation criteria.</p> <p>6.3 Grantees who do not receive research funds supporting from another source.</p> <p>6.4 The funding decision by the Graduate School is considered final without any appeal.</p>
7. Terms and Conditions	<p>7.1 A grantee must submit a certificate of dissemination of completed work to the community before terminating the grant.</p> <p>7.2 Grantees must adhere to the Prince of Songkla University Announcement Re: Guidelines on Research Grant for Thesis of Graduate Studies Students, which was issued on July 1, 2021.</p> <p>7.3 Grantees must present evidence of grant disbursement to the grantee's faculty within two fiscal years of receiving the award for verification.</p>
